

Angie Badders Kreitzer – Greater Dayton USBC WBA



Angie Badders Kreitzer has been deceased since 2003. She was only thirty-four years old at the time of her death.

In the nine short years that she was a member of WIBC and the Ohio WBA she captured four state championship tournaments titles and was Ohio WBA Queens Champion in 1997.

Angie's highest average was 221 in 2002-03, her highest series 772 in 2001-02, and her highest game 300 bowled in 1996.

Her Ohio state championship titles were team actual in 2003, team actual and handicap in 2001, team actual in 1999 and team actual in 1998. In addition to winning the Queens Tournament in 1997 she was second in 2002.

She also had the title of World Team Challenge Champion in 1998.

In her local Dayton WBA association she won the Dayton WBA team handicap in 1997, Dayton mixed doubles in 1997, Dayton mixed team in 1997, Dayton WBA team actual in 1998 and Dayton mixed team in 2002.

She was selected for the Dayton WBA All Star Team in 2001-02 and 2002-03.

For her accomplishments, we add the name of Angie Badders Kreitzer to the rolls of the Ohio USBC Women's Bowling Association Hall of Fame for SUPERIOR PERFORMANCE.
